ALERT!! Possible Scam Phone Calls to Parishioners. To All Locations:

Message from the Diocese Finance Office: We have been made aware of a telephone scam seeking to get donors to redirect their donations to a different bank account. The caller falsely represents themselves as a representative of the Diocese and the parish. The caller claims that the bank accounts have been changed and that the parishioner needs to redirect online payments to a new bank account.

Neither the Diocese nor any parish location would contact a donor asking them to change the bank account for their electronic donations. Be wary of all phone scams!

The 9th & 10th Commandments for May-Week 1

**“You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife.”
“You shall not covet your neighbor’s goods.”**

This month we conclude our journey through with the 9th Commandment, “You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife/spouse.” and the 10th Commandment, “You shall not covet your neighbor’s goods.”

God warns us about coveting to help us avoid acting on the negative emotions of covetousness. When we covet, we compare ourselves and the blessings of our lives with that of others. Comparing fosters jealousy and ill-will toward others that often provokes one to harm others, either with words or with our actions.

The object of covetousness might be something tangible such as cars, clothes, and money. Or it can be something intangible such as prestige, pleasure, friendships, or success.

Over the next week, be attentive to how covetousness may have found a comfortable place in your heart. Then, consider some practical, healthy, and holy ways to replace that covetousness with authentic love, compassion, and friendship.
